## **Description of necessary first aid measures**

**Eye contact**

# 5. Fire-fighting measures

### Extinguishing media

Specific hazards arising from the chemical

: Flammable aerosol. Runoff to sewer may create fire or explosion hazard. In a fire or if heated, a pressure increase will occur and the container may burst, with the risk of a subsequent explosion. # Appropriate engineering controls
